



60-Mile County Championship: Official Race Rules & Rider Guide

Race Date & Start Time: 8:30 AM – Mass start for all categories.

Start/Finish Venue: Zink Ranch, 7716 Zink Ranch Rd, Skiatook, OK 74070

Championship Categories & Awards

Only participants officially registered for the **60-Mile Championship Route** are eligible for championship awards. All category winners will be awarded a custom **MUMU County Championship Jersey**.

Championship categories are awarded across **Men's, Women's, and Non-Binary** divisions:

- Overall Champion
- Under 18
- 19–29
- 30–39
- 40–49
- 50–59
- 60+
- Single Speed
- Tandem (Open)

Timing & Scoring

- **Scoring Method:** Official results and category placements are determined by chip time.
- **Start Format:** Mass start at 8:30 AM.
- **Neutral Rollout:** The first mile from the start line are strictly neutral on asphalt.
Racing officially begins at the start mat just after the first hill inside the Ranch.

Podiums for County Championships

Podiums will be done as soon as the 3rd person crosses the line for each category. So please stick around so we can celebrate with you and the others for your accomplishments. If for whatever reason you can not stay please get with Amy Strahan Chief of Podiums and tell her. She does need to collect some information from you before leaving.



Course Navigation & Self-Sufficiency

- **Self-Navigation Required:** While key intersections will have directional arrows, racers are 100% responsible for their own navigation. **Download the official GPX route to your GPS head unit/smartphone prior to race day.**
- **Public Roads:** Once riders exit Zink Ranch at Gate 11, the race takes place on open public roads. Rules of the road apply at all times.
- **Self-Supported Format:**
 - **No outside support vehicles (SAG)** are allowed on course under any circumstances. Any rider receiving assistance from an unauthorized support vehicle will be **immediately disqualified**.
 - Vehicles are only permitted on course to retrieve a rider who is "pulling the plug" (abandoning the race).
 - **Rider-to-rider assistance is fully permitted** (sharing tools, tubes, nutrition, or mechanical help).
 - **No gear drops.**
- **Aid & Resupply:** Official aid stations are limited (check the RideWithGPS route sheet for exact mile markers). Riders are advised to carry cash/card to resupply at on-course stops like Dollar General if needed.

Road Conditions & Equipment Note

- Osage County gravel consists primarily of crushed white chat—fast and highly rideable even in wet conditions, without the flint-rock tire hazards common to the Flint Hills.
- However, this is an unassisted gravel race: carry your own flat repair kit, multi-tool, hydration, and a smartphone (both for emergency navigation and to capture the stunning Osage County vistas and hopefully a few Monarch butterfly migrating through).
